The Book Group has finished reading *A Man Called Ove*. It was well liked and tells the story of Ove, a grumpy old man, who is unimpressed by the modern world and expects disappointment at every turn. He is a person who takes "responsibility for things" and more importantly knows how to fix them. This places him in high demand by those around him which rather upsets his desire to be left alone. However, in helping out others – if only for a bit of peace and quiet in the vain hope he won't be disturbed again - he makes some important discoveries about himself and those around him.

I sometimes worry about the emphasis placed on attracting the 'young' to church and what it might be saying to everyone else who isn't or doesn't describe themselves as young. Are they somehow less important or less welcome? I hope that in this Team we value everyone and make all welcome whatever age they might be.

Nevertheless, *A Man Called Ove* is a reminder that those with a bit more experience than the rest of us should not be forgotten, ignored or, worse still, put up with - just because they can't operate a mobile phone, for example. Actually, the gifts that Ove had to offer were rare talents - sorely lacking in lots of others. He became a sort of superhero because he was just so practical. Despite being such a curmudgeon, he was a person of great love. The book is partly about love. Love between a couple certainly but also the love of a community in which all have a place and a part to play. It tells us that we all have something to offer and, if we have the patience and the tenacity to find out, we might be pleasantly surprised just by what we all can do!
